EBC abstracts manager - Terms & conditions

Contributions submitted as abstracts:

Abstracts should be written in clear and concise English. The abstract submitted should relate to the background, the outcome and the relevance of the study and its presentation. Equally, the abstract should reflect the information to be presented as far as possible. The first author is usually the designated presenting author. A presentation by an individual who is not an author of the abstract is granted only under special circumstances. Information and possible permission should, in that case, be sought from the EBC secretariat.

EBC requests authors to adhere to the concept of originality mainly with respect to quality; a review which is well-researched and encompasses some new insights theoretically has the same right to selection (or de-selection) as would an original study which may be flawed, unduly presumptious about results or conclusions, or poorly structured. Furthermore, EBC reserves the right to abbreviate abstracts if author(s) have neglected to heed the limitations of word count during the submission process.

Abstract selection post submission:

All abstracts submitted will be reviewed "blind" (with authors' names and authors' affiliations hidden from view) by a team of brewing scientists and specialists once the window period of submission has closed. These appointed individuals are normally drawn from within the EBC Executive Team, the EBC Analysis Group and the EBC Brewing Science Group. Prior publication of the work at another conference or in a scientific or industry journal does not automatically preclude it from being accepted. Authors whose abstracts that are not selected on the grounds of a perceived lack of either quality or relevance will be informed. Likewise, authors whose contributions have to be rejected because of a lack of presentation slots will also be contacted; in that case, alternate arrangements for future presentation possibilities may be suggested and suitable abstracts thus retained, if mutually agreed to.

Dissemination of information arising as a result of an EBC event:

The submitting author(s) hereby agree to make their contribution available to the organisers of the EBC technical and scientific events for a period of 12 months after the start of the event, to registered participants of the event only. After this period has elapsed, the contribution will then be publicly available via the knowledge platform of The Brewers of Europe, BrewUp. Contributions are defined by their reference (title, author(s), authors' affiliation), their abstract as well as an electronic version of the presentation, usually consisting of slides in the case of oral presentations (powerpoint or pdf), or an image of the poster (jpeg, pdf, etc.). In essence, authors grant to EBC a copyright for publication of material they may provide for inclusion in possible proceedings for the event. Should author(s) not be in agreement, for whatever reason, to have their presentation made available to either participants or the public via BrewUp, or both, a request should be sent to the secretariat of EBC to that effect a minimum of 3 weeks prior to the start of the event.
